Innovative Masks

Ashley Lawrence, 21, is studying education for the deaf and hard of hearing, and knows the importance of face visibility for those who rely on lip reading or **American Sign Language** to communicate.

With that in mind, she's creating reusable fabric masks that feature a clear plastic piece over the wearer's mouth so that their lips are still visible.



"[These are] for anyone who uses speech reading, lip reading, anybody like that, and people who are profoundly deaf who use ASL as their primary mode of communication," she told NBC. "ASL is very big on facial expressions and it is part of the grammar I felt like there was a huge population that was being looked over. We're all panicking right

This Day in September

- **September 1, 1939** At 5:30 A.M. Hitler's armies invaded Poland starting World War II in Europe.
- September 4, 1781 Los Angeles was founded by the Spanish Governor of California, Felipe de Neve, near the site of the Native American village of Yang-na. The original name was *El Pueblo de la Reina de Los Angeles* (The Town of the Queen of the Angels).
- September 11, 2001 The worst terrorist attack in US history occurred as four large passenger jets were hijacked and crashed, killing nearly 3,000 people.
- September 15, 1916 Tanks were fist used in combat, during the allied offensive at the battle of the Somme, in World War I.

Old Animal is New News >



Scientists have discovered the world's oldest land animal, according to the Mashable website. It resembled a millipede, and its scientific name is **Kampecaris Obanensis**—and it lived some 425 million years ago.

Its segmented body was about an inch long. Despite its appearance, scientists don't consider it a millipede but a member of an extinct species. It probably lived in a lakeside environment and subsisted on decomposing plants during the Silurian period, when sea levels were much higher. A fossil of the Kampecaris was found near fossils of the world's oldest known stemmed plant, the Cooksonia.

Although scientists say this is the world's oldest land animal, other paleontologists believe that it may be predated by soil worms, some of which evolved some 25 million years earlier. Life started forming in the Earth's oceans some 540 million years ago, with plants such as mosses emerging onto land some 450 million years ago. The development of plants like the Cooksonia helped support the development of land animals. The first land vertebrates—amphibians—appeared around 375 million years ago. *
